OPENING: Jo opened the meeting at 8:03 pm with the Serenity Prayer.

TRADITIONS READ: Jim from the No Hassle Group read the Traditions.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jack: Passed the basket - \$121.80 collected

- Contribution for new equipment posted in May. New computers are in place and lightning fast.
- The \$1734 computer and internet expense covered the transition our telephones and internet connectivity from three vendors to one vendor (AT&T). We also bought a tablet to track sales.
- The Asset Cash Schedule (page 2) was added the Financial Report to show financial health of Intergroup office.
- Question asked regarding Point of Sale not reflected for first 2 months of the year. We have reports on what we
 did the first two months and the inventory as of today.

OFFICE REPORT: Lincoln

- The Texas State Convention State was an extremely productive event for Intergroup. Volunteer turnout was outstanding and we recruited new volunteers from the event. We communicated with many people about what Intergroup does. We showed History of AA in Dallas" was a big hit. It highlighted the Intergroup archives that also describe how AA started in Dallas. Over \$1,000 worth of AAWS and Grapevine books sold.
- The work at the Texas State Convention is a good example of how we can help groups, when we know about what is available.
- Working with Nightwatch Chair Keith D and past-chair Jimmy D. to discuss best practices for Nightwatch. We have discussed asking existing schedulers to mentor new ones, how to vet new Nightwatch volunteers, and documenting best practices.
- Participation from our AA community is up. This is helping in many areas, including groups keeping our meetings current, new service activities and the District 54 DCM even came to our office to ask how they could help us.
- Attending District meetings and groups to get new qualified volunteers at our Intergroup office. Volunteers
 created and are maintaining a guide to document how to perform daily activities. We now have a scheduler for
 office volunteers, handling many tasks.

BOARD REPORT: Jo M.

- Freda W. and Stu R. are working with the Nominating committee to identify potential Intergroup candidates. There are 9 board positions and 5 will be rolling off. The board positions are not assigned ahead of time but are decided once on the Board. The chair is the only position that comes from the previous Board. Between now and October, the committee will be tasked with getting at least ten (preferably 12) candidates, preferably more, who are willing to stand for the Board. In October and November the nominees will come to introduce themselves and give their service resume.
- The minimum sobriety is two (2) years, and a resident of the Dallas metro area for at least two years. No Trustee may serve while he or she is serving concurrently as an Area Delegate, a District (DCM), or Group Representative (GSR) or in any other official AA capacity other than within an AA group; or work for any entity that charges for services to an alcoholic or serves on the Board of Trustees of such an entity. No more than two persons from an AA group shall serve as elected Trustees or Director.
- Our Accountant came to our Board meeting to tell us that we have successfully filed our 2017 tax return, and 2016 amended tax returns.
- We are compiling a notebook for each Board member. The info will include a job description of Intergroup Board service roles (such as CPC/PI) as well Board member functions (e.g., Chair, Alternate Chair, Treasurer, and

Secretary). We will also include all operational information such as an Employee Handbook, Bylaws, Policies and Procedures, and Insurance information. When we complete this, these will be available for anyone to review.

- It is tradition to not have a meeting in August so reps do not need to come to the monthly meeting in August.
- Question about advising a group on how to work as a non-profit. Lincoln took the action to help.
